This conversation will take place in person on November 9, 2022 at Lone Tree Arts Center. Equity, Educators, and Workforce Transformation is the 8th conversation in the series and the first to be held in person. Refreshments will be served at 6 p.m. and the discussion will begin at 7 p.m.
