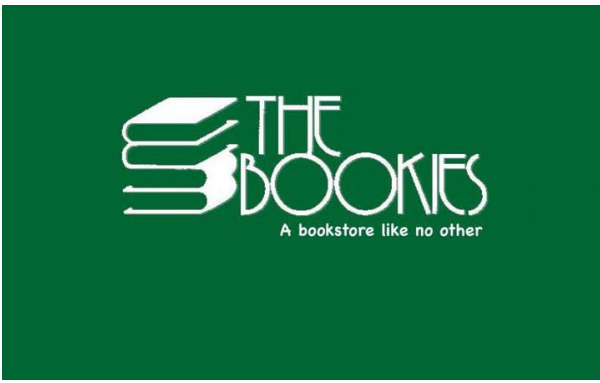


Submissions for Colorado Book Awards Now Open

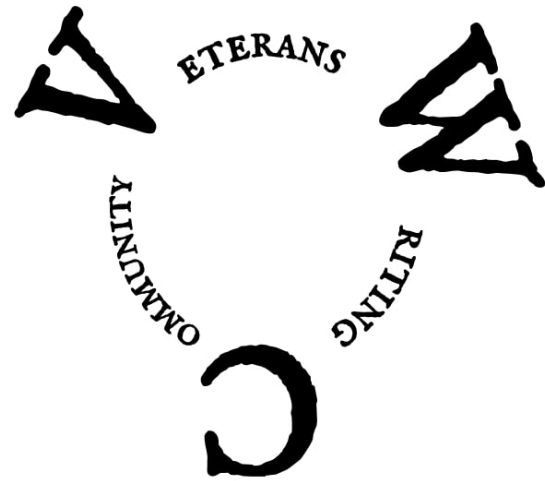

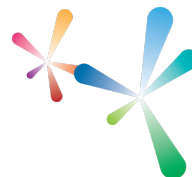
